The mission of the School of Family and Consumer Sciences at Northern Illinois University is to generate and transmit knowledge that supports families and individuals in meeting human needs for self-development, social interaction, resource allocation, clothing, and hospitality. All programs lay the groundwork for graduate study.

All three emphases in Human Development and Family Sciences prepare the student to work as professionals serving families and children. The *Family Social Services* emphasis is intended for students who seek entry-level employment in family service, family life education, mental health, or community welfare agencies which serve primarily older children, adolescents, adults, couples, and/or the elderly. It is recommended as preparation for advanced degrees in social work, Human Development and Family Sciences, marriage and family therapy, and related fields. Students hoping to do graduate work should strongly consider a minor in sociology, psychology, or political science.

A student who enters the program with the courses as listed and who have completed an A.A. or A.S. degree can usually expect to complete the NIU program in two years.
